

HISTORY

Established in 1978, Chanel College remains the only Catholic secondary school in the Wairarapa.

Chanel College was formed through the merger of two schools:

- St Joseph's College for Boys, founded in 1945 by Monsignor Nicholas Moore and run by the Marist Brothers.
- St Bride's College for Girls, founded in 1898 by the Brigidine Sisters.

Our school stands on the original site of St Joseph's College.

Our Heritage and Symbols

Our emblem reflects our heritage. It combines the Brigidine Cross with a stylised M, representing the Brigidine Sisters and Marist Brothers, who helped shape our school.

Honouring Our Legacy

Each year, scholarships - supported by the St Bride's Old Girls Association and the

St Joseph's Old Boys' Association - help preserve their legacy and support future generations of students.

A Catholic Education for the Wairarapa

Chanel College is owned by the Wellington Archdiocese. It serves the Catholic community by providing a faith-based education. In 1981, it became an Integrated School, ensuring that Catholic education remains accessible to future generations.

In 2028, Chanel College will proudly celebrate 50 years of Catholic education in the Wairarapa.

At Chanel College, our faith is at the heart of everything we do. Preference Enrolment Criteria

Preference enrolment is granted to Catholic students, who must be baptised Catholic or have a Catholic parent or grandparent.

A preference certificate, signed by the Parish Priest, is required before the school can consider enrolment.

The criteria used by Proprietors and their authorised agents to determine a family's connection to the Catholic Special Character are available on our website.



MARAUTANGA CURRICULUM

At Chanel College, we offer a structured yet adaptable learning environment that supports students at every stage of their education. Our approach fosters collaboration, creativity, and curiosity, ensuring students develop the skills and knowledge they need for the future.

Year 7 & 8 – A Strong Foundation

Our Year 7 & 8 students learn core subjects -Reading, Writing, Mathematics, Social Studies/Inquiry, and Religious Educationwithin their Rōpū space, a collaborative setting led by experienced primary teachers.

They also benefit from specialist instruction in Science, PE, Te Reo, Technology, and Art. Technology and Art subjects rotate each term, giving students a taster of each discipline.

Year 9 – Expanding Horizons

Year 9 students continue learning in a collaborative Rōpū setting, where teachers integrate the curriculum to support individual needs.

- **Core Subjects:** English, Mathematics, Social Studies/Inquiry, and Religious Education (taught by the Year 9 team).
- **Specialist Subjects:** Science, PE, Technology, and the Arts.
- Integrated Technology & Arts Project: A half-year project combining multiple subjects, culminating in a showcase event.

Year 10 – Connected Learning

In Year 10, students take greater ownership of their learning by selecting a Kaupapa (theme), which integrates across all subjects to create a meaningful, real-world learning experience.

- **Core Subjects:** Religious Education, English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, PE, and Technology & Arts Projects.
- **NCEA Opportunities:** Students can sit NCEA assessments within their courses.
- Integrated Technology & Arts Project:

Like in Year 9, students complete a half-year project, culminating in a showcase event.

Years 11-13 – Pathways for the Future

As students progress into their senior years, they begin shaping their future pathways.

- **Students choose five subjects:** Religious Education and four electives.
- Electives can be semester-long or full-year courses, allowing students to specialise or explore new interests.

Opportunities for Every Student

We offer a broad curriculum designed to support different learning styles and interests.

- Junior students explore a wide range of subjects and extracurricular activities.
- Senior students engage in NCEA assessments over two semesters, with opportunities for both academic and hands-on learning.

At Chanel College, we recognise that success looks different for every student.

Our goal is to inspire a love for learning while ensuring that students achieve their academic goals.

Subject Opportunities

We offer a wide variety of subjects for students to choose from.

Our junior school students are offered opportunities across a wide range of subjects and extracurricular activities based on their special interests and talents. While our senior students are given the opportunity to participate in national forms of assessment (NCEA), over two semesters per year.

We recognise not every student's success will fit in an academic rubric. Our students will be encouraged to study subjects that interest them and encourage life-long learning while meeting assessment criteria.

Taha Tinana

At Chanel College, we know the importance of physical health and well-being, in particular the positive impact it has on a student's learning. We have dedicated one hour per week to nurturing our tinana (body) through regular physical activity and a dedicated health education programme from Years 7-13.

In the Summer terms, students choose from

a range of activities/sports and in the Winter terms students stay in Year level classes to work through a planned Health programme specific to their ages.

Ako Kotahi Service Programme

As a Catholic school built on Marist and Brigidine values, we prioritise Service. Our Ako Kotahi Service programme is a dedicated onehour slot each week where students work with a teacher on a Service project.

At Chanel College, we believe that every student has the potential to lead. Our leadership opportunities empower students to serve, inspire, and make a difference in our school and the wider community.

- House Captains Lead and unite their House, fostering school spirit through events, competitions, and pastoral care.
- **Student Council** Represent student voices, organise initiatives, and advocate for positive changes in the school.
- Catholic Character Prefects & Team -Promote and lead faith-based initiatives, supporting the spiritual life of the college through prayer, liturgies, and service.

- Prefects Senior student leaders who embody our school values, mentor younger students, and lead across various areas of school life.

- Year 10 Runner A key liaison role, assisting with school events, leadership duties, and supporting senior student leaders.

Leadership Development Experiences

- Young Catholic Leaders (YCL) An annual leadership programme run by the Archdiocese of Wellington, where our Prefect team joins student leaders from seven other Catholic colleges for a fiveday camp focused on faith, service, and leadership.
- Marist Leaders Camp (Kaiapoi) A unique opportunity for student leaders to develop their leadership skills through Marist values

and traditions, learning from experienced mentors in a faith-based setting.

- Year 11 Marist Sailing Trip An unforgettable experience where Year 11 students develop leadership, teamwork, and resilience while sailing in the spirit of the Marist tradition.
- Year 12 Leadership Camp A dedicated camp for Year 12 students, designed to prepare them for leadership roles in their final year, fostering teamwork, communication, and responsibility.
- Year 13 Hikoi to the Hokianga A pilgrimage experience where our Year 13 students journey to the Hokianga to explore the roots of Catholicism in Aotearoa, deepening their faith and understanding of our Catholic story.

Faith in Action: Outreach & Community Service

As a Catholic school, we believe in giving back and ensuring our students live out the Gospel values through real-world action. Our servicebased leadership programmes help students develop compassion, responsibility, and a strong sense of social justice.

Supporting Every Student

At Chanel College, we are dedicated to supporting our students both academically and pastorally. By working closely with caregivers, whānau, and students, we ensure that support is equitable, inclusive, and responsive to individual needs.

Learning Support

We believe every student deserves equitable access to learning. Our full-time SENCO leads a skilled team of Learning Support Facilitators, ensuring students with high needs are included in all classroom activities.

- Te Wāhi Awhina a dedicated space for students who need a quiet environment for interventions, group learning, or selfregulation.
- ESOL Support our committed ESOL Tutor helps students navigate English as a Second Language, ensuring they thrive in their learning.

House System - A School Whānau

Our House System provides students with a strong sense of belonging. Each student is part of a House Group that supports both their pastoral and academic journey.

- Heads of House Staff members responsible for the well-being and pastoral care of students from Years 7-13.
- Atawhai Teachers Each student stays with the same Atawhai teacher throughout their time at Chanel College, ensuring a

consistent support person for learning and pastoral needs.

House Captains - Student leaders who promote participation and school values, fostering a strong House spirit.

Learning Opportunities Beyond The Classroom

At Chanel College, we provide unique learning opportunities beyond the classroom to develop well-rounded, future-ready students.

- Senior Life Skills All Year 11-13 students participate in a one-hour Life Skills class each week. This carefully designed programme prepares students for life beyond school, covering essential skills for independence and success.
- Ako Kotahi A whole-school service hour where students choose a service project, reinforcing that helping others is central to our Catholic identity.
- **Taha Tinana** A dedicated hour of physical activity each week, where students can:
- Extend and accelerate progress in their chosen sport.
- > Learn a new skill
- > Engage in simple, enjoyable activities like walking, Zumba, cycling, or swimming.

These experiences enrich student learning, build character, and encourage personal growth.

International Students

Chanel College has welcomed international students from around the world for many years. As a signatory to the Code of Practice for the Pastoral Care of International Students, we are committed to providing both strong academic support and exceptional pastoral care. With a small intake each year, we ensure every international student receives personalised attention and a high-quality education.

Our college is located in Masterton, Wairarapa, part of the Greater Wellington region. Nestled in a semi-rural setting, we offer a unique balance of community-focused learning and diverse opportunities, all within a 90-minute drive from Wellington City, the capital of New Zealand.



Timetable

Our school day begins at 8:50 AM with a Check & Connect Atawhai session, followed by the first class at 9:00 AM. Students attend five 60-minute periods, with the school day concluding at 3:00 PM.

Key Features of Our Timetable:

- Years 7, 8 & 9 have Ropū classes for core subjects: Mathematics, English, and Social Studies.
- Period 4 (Tuesday & Thursday): Split between Atawhai time and Assemblies/ House Meetings.
- Period 5 (Wednesday): Ako Kotahi Service Period - dedicated to community service and learning.
- **Period 5 (Friday)** Taha Tinana Wellbeing promoting physical and mental health.
- Period 4 (Monday): Senior Hauora Life Skills Period - supporting holistic development.



Uniform

Upon enrolment, families will receive detailed information about our school uniform, including guidelines and purchasing options.

Facilities & Support

Chanel College provides students with access to a wide range of facilities to support academic, sporting, and extracurricular development:

- Full-sized Gymnasium Indoor courts for basketball, volleyball, and other sports.
- Netball & Tennis Courts High-quality playing surfaces.

Attendance Dues & Fees

Chanel College operates under New Zealand's donations scheme, meaning there are no compulsory school fees.

However, some subjects and extracurricular activities may incur additional costs for materials and association fees.

Key Information on Attendance Dues:

- Accounts are issued by the Catholic Schools' Board to fund the maintenance of school buildings and property.
- Payments are administered by the Archdiocese of Wellington.
- The Catholic Schools Board website provides up-to-date fee information and payment methods.
- A local parish committee monitors payments.
- Families experiencing financial hardship are encouraged to discuss options with the parish priest or principal.
